The year is moving by quickly and we are now into fall. The first year of the merger continues to move forward in a smooth manner with many positive outcomes. Lakes Community Cooperative financially had a good first half of the year with many divisions having strong financial performances and increases in efficiency have helped control costs in an inflationary environment. With this good financial performance, the Board decided to send out the old Lakes Area Cooperative 2022 patronage checks a littler earlier this year. With some of the struggles going on within the dairy industry we hoped this would help bring a little relief and some added cash flow to the farm. The Board also approved the retirement of year 2002 for former Community Co-op Patrons of Lake Park and those checks will be sent out later in the year.

Lakes Community Cooperative will have retired over 1.5 million dollars back to the patron this year as well as paying out 1.8 million in cash from the previous year's earnings. This shows the strength of your cooperative and its dedication to returning savings back to its patrons. To continue to retire equity and plan for future equity retirements we need to update some of the patron information. Some patrons will be receiving a letter in the mail this fall requesting an update to your information in our system such as date of birth, change of address or name corrections. This is vital information that we need to make sure we are able to return your equity to you so I thank you in advance for returning that information to us when requested.

I have had the privilege of getting to know a number of the patrons over these first eight months and have been able to reintroduce myself to a number of patrons that I worked with previously back in my Co-op SAMPO days. I look forward to getting to meet more of you going forward.

Petroleum Department: Shawn Starkey

The beans are within days of coming off, this will put our drivers into full gear. We have a good group of guys ready to help with your fuel needs. Kevin in Perham, Mike in Menahga, Josh & Jared in Lake Park and Dave in Mahnomen.

Bulk fuel department has been growing every year, and with the merger, will keep on increasing gallons sold. We also have a group of salesmen out knocking on doors, Jeff in the Perham area, Will in Lake Park area and Rocky covering the Mahnomen area. The bulk department has recently started a large project of moving our Winger Bulk Plant to the Mahnomen area. This will help us become more centralized in that area, creating less miles on the trucks. This bulk plant will be state of the art, with bottom feeding capability. Thus, keeping the driver off the top of trucks. The plan is to do 1 bulk facility per year. LCC currently has five bulk plants, Perham, Menahga, Lake Park, Twin Valley and soon Mahnomen.

We offer fuel deliveries off our 5 straight trucks, with transport loads also available. With the rising cost of fuel, a lot of people have upsized their tanks, increasing their storage when prices are lower. Contracting is another way to control expenses. With only \$.75 down per gallon, you can lock in your fuel needs and prices without having to worry about the fluctuating markets. Prebuying is another way to lock in prices. We have over 670,000 gallons of storage available.

LCC carries Cenex Premium Fieldmaster, Roadmaster, and lubricants. #2 fuels without the Cenex additive packages are also available. Our services are provided to patrons large and small. We also sell Fillrite pumps, hoses, nozzles, filter, tanks of all sizes, def(diesel exhaust fluid), pretty much anything you need for your operation. Call for an estimate. LCC offers The Cenex Total Protection Plan. This is an industry leading warranty coverage of your new and used equipment. Please contact your sales person for more information.

We have monitors available at only \$29.00 per year. We have many monitored tanks, that send us signals once a day and when your tank is at 30% and again at 15%. There is an app available for you to follow and monitor your tank(s) as well. We have recently installed some on large transport tanks. It is a great tool to control your fuel inventory and have us keep you full during busy times. LCC Petroleum Department is gearing up for a busy fall. Propane, what do you think when you hear or see that word? Did you know that it is a domestic energy and that 90% of it is produced and supplied here in the United States? Did you know that it is a low carbon energy source and that it can make fewer greenhouse gas emissions then gasoline, diesel and electricity in a lot of applications? For example a tank less water heater produces 50% less carbon emissions then the storage tank electric water heaters. Lots of people think about propane when they fire up the grill or need heat in the deer stand, but you can also heat your water, cook your food, dry your clothes, power your vehicle, heat your home and countless other things. So when you need to change out those electrical appliances in your home or business, consider using propane.

Professional Agronomy Services: Charlie Guck

Looking back at the spring of 2023, small grain planting was a little later than we would have liked to see. Corn and beans were also a little late, but they were planted in good time when we started. We did see some germination issues due to dry soil conditions in some of the later planted crops. With less than desired rainfall and some high temperatures during those dry periods we will have yields that will be all over the board.

I'd like to talk a little on some of the challenges of supplying fertilizer for our customers. When we look at the logistics of moving fertilizer, we rely heavily on the Mississippi river. There have always been challenges with the river and there always will be. For example, last fall the river was low but with the snow melt from last winter and some spring rains the river levels started out too high this spring and by June the river levels were low again. What does this mean for us? When the river is too high or too low, they can't move the barges to the terminals to unload them and in some cases, they can only bring half full barges up the river. There were times this spring that we had to wait for products until they could dredge the river to get the barges to their scheduled terminals. In one case we were able to find another terminal to unload a barge but that doesn't come without cost. Even though there were days we were close to running out of certain products, we were always able to procure enough product to service our customers.

Seed selling season will be here shortly. Please keep in mind your weed control needs for the 2024 season. There are many options for herbicide tolerant varieties and hybrids available and they are not all equal. Our staff would be happy to go over your plan for next year and place the right seed on the right acre. It is also time to get your fields soil sampled for next year. We can either take composite or grid samples for you. Let us know as you are done harvesting fields and we can get them taken for you.

We would like to thank you for your business and as harvest season approaches remember to take the time to be safe.

The Milk Department: Luke Flink, Manager



We would like to take this opportunity to send out a friendly reminder about ice/snow. Over the past couple of years, our drivers have had some slip/falls on ice at farms. Areas where the milk truck drivers walk seem to be especially prone to icy conditions.

We would like to ask that our farmers, please remember to clear the snow near the hose port, and areas where the milk truck driver needs to walk. Also, please sand or salt any slippery surfaces when needed. (beneath the porthole always seems to be prone to ice).

2 cans Pork & Beans

1 can Butter Beans (drain & rinse)

1 can Kidney Beans (drain & rinse)

1 can Navy Beans (drain & rinse)

1 can Northern Beans (drain & rinse)

1 can Pinto Beans (drain & rinse)

1 can Black Beans (drain & rinse)

1 lb Bacon strips - chopped

1 large Onion - chopped

1 large sweet Yellow Bell Pepper chopped

1 large sweet Red Bell Pepper chopped

6 cloves Garlic - minced

½ tsp Pepper

2 bottles of your favorite Barbeque Sauce

1/4 cup Brown Sugar

1/3 cup vinegar

Preheat oven to 350

Brown bacon in large skillet, Remove from grease and drain on a paper towel. Discard bacon grease except for 3 tablespoons. In the same pan as you browned bacon, with the reserved grease saute vegetables until tender. In the meanwhile, put your drained beans, pork n beans, pepper, bbq sauce, brown sugar and vinegar into a Dutch oven or large casserole dish. Add the vegetables to beans. Combine.

Bake for 1 – 1 ½ hours until heated thoroughly. ENJOY!

For options replace one can of beans with a can of Chick peas. Browned hamburger or sausage works great. Add 1T Liquid smoke for a smokey flavor. Chop a Chipotle Pepper with the Vegetables for a bit of heat. Great over a hot dog for that tailgate party.
